November 11th - Parent/Teacher Conferences

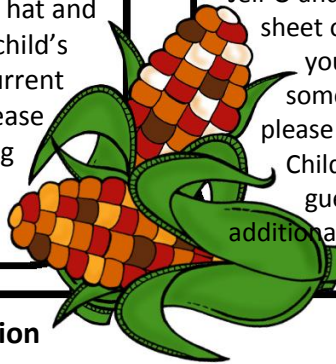
I will be offering parent/teacher conferences; look for a sign-up sheet for available times. If these times do not work for you, please contact me and I would be happy to arrange a different time.

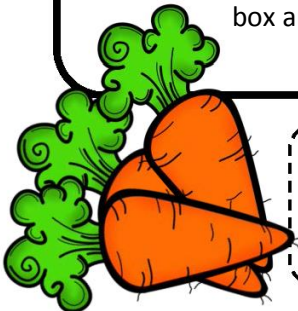
Children will be charged for lunch, however guests will enjoy the feast at no
